**Blending Photos with Fabric: Lily Pond Quilt Project**

The secrets of this tranquil water lily pond quilt are in the block shapes and setting and the integration of actual water lily photos into the piece. Learn how to print photos onto fabric (we'll use my lily pond photos in class but the process will work for your own photos later on). Learn the role that scanners, digital cameras, photo software and printers play to get crisp, richly colored images on fabric. Use the latest products to make your fabric images soft, washable, and lightfast. After preparing and printing onto fabric, we'll begin making a wallhanging using your choice of several techniques for Drunkard's Path block construction

Fabric Printing Kit - teacher supplied (\$10 kit fee collected in class) :

- High thread count white cotton fabric for printing
- Bubble Jet Set
- Adhesive backed carrier for printing fabric sheets
- Already prepared fabric sheets for printing
- Printer inks

Stash Fabric:

The lily pond is basically a scrap quilt made of 4" Drunkard's Path blocks. The color palette consists of various values of brown, greens (including lime), purple, gray-blue and blue-black and a bit of yellow. You will be blending your fabric with lily pond photographs supplied by the teacher. Bring a selection of ½ yd (or larger) pieces in the above colors.

- Piecing thread
- Basic sewing supplies including sewing scissors
- Rotary cutter, ruler and mat
- Sewing machine in good working order
- A personal iron and ironing surface is a plus if you can manage it.
